## English Focus

As our English focus next week, we will be re-enacting the story, Katie in London followed by mapping the story from beginning to the end. Finally, we will be recounting and writing the story using adjectives, adverbs and expanded noun phrases.

Please continue to enjoy the shared reading experience with your child. Discuss hidden meanings and explore the rich language in the text.

## Important Messages

When you collect your child at the end of the day, please ensure that you come close to where your child's class teacher is so s/he can see you before dismissing the child.

## Maths Focus

In Maths we will be building on our understanding of counting in equal intervals when finding the total of the score in a tally chart. Children will be comparing 2 different tally scores. They will record a score on a number line showing jumps of 5 and ones and recording a score as a tally. Children will be shown that it is more efficient to count an amount in 5s. In order to deepen their understanding they will be provided with experiences to create more tally charts from their own collected data, such as tallying the colours of pencils in their pencil pot. Children could also create a simple survey on, for example, eye colour, favourite snack, sandwich or fruit from 3-4 choices. The following is an example of a tally chart.
