English Focus






Please continue to enjoy the shared reading experience with your child and ensure their reading record is signed and returned daily to the class teacher.

For English next week, we will be changing parts of the story. This will include changing the characters and settings.

Maths Focus

Next week we will continue to Interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables. Children will be introduced how to construct pictograms to display data effectively by choosing the most appropriate key (for example, choosing one symbol to represent two, five or ten items as appropriate). Children will read and interpret pictograms. They will find totals and compare. We will be asking questions for example: What does the key say? How many objects does each symbol represent? Children will be expected to answer questions relating to pictograms accurately and in detail, including where one symbol represents more than one item. The following is an example of a pictogram.

Each ● represents one creature.
