Science

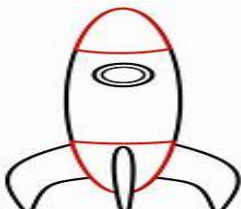
Next week is SCIENCE WEEK so there will be lots of science investigations going on. Please help your child complete the science poster competition.

The children will be planning and designing a rocket and listing what they would need to make their rocket.

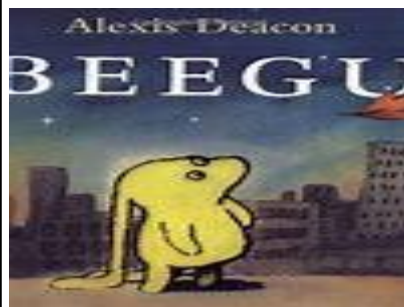


English:

Maths

Counting in twos, fives and tens and using a hundred square to identify patterns.

They will be given sets of objects and encouraged to count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

They will have to describe the sets of numbers they land on. Such as even numbers when counting in 2s, 5 and 0, when counting in 5s and only 0s when counting in 10s.
